*“In August, I was assisting a client with her personal emergency response system (PERS) and phone line. I explained that their landline was an unnecessary expense, especially since they had been struggling to pay all their bills.*

*They decided to disconnect the landline and switch to a new PERS that works off cell towers. This move eliminated a \$135 monthly expense, saving them \$1,620 a year!*

*Their dream was to visit the beach again and see the ocean, so they used their savings from eliminating the landline to take a trip to Myrtle Beach where they spent time watching the waves, shopping, and enjoying seafood with their daughter.”*

## UNLIMITED IMPROVEMENTS

Technology plays a vital role in **enhancing the quality of care and reducing stress** for caregivers supporting residential homes. With increased independence as a guiding star, smart home technology has been fully implemented into all six (6) residential homes supporting individuals through voice-activated capabilities, audible & visual reminders, and enhanced home safety measures including smart locks and public space security cameras.

Looking ahead, the organization plans to further expand its use of technology by integrating additional smart home automation tools, telehealth solutions, and real-time monitoring systems to enhance safety, communication, and efficiency in caregiving to reduce caregiver workload, improve response times, and ultimately enhance the overall well-being of our community.

# UNLIMITED RESOURCES

Through grant funding and education from The Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank, the organization successfully submitted referrals for 40 employees and clients who now live with greater comfort and security.


Through dedicated work, the agency added one (1) new transportation route supporting children with autism transporting youth to early intervention programs.

Additionally, the agency launched a new program supporting local transportation. The Bus Pass Program benefits both full-time and part-time employees providing a monthly bus pass for travel to and from work, as well as personal and recreational use to support work-life balance.

*“One of my most memorable moments came when a client, who was unable to fully access their bathtub, was longing for a safe, accessible shower.*

*After suggesting a home modification grant, I visited again and was met with a huge hug and a heartfelt ‘thank you’. They had been awarded the grant money, and a contractor was already scheduled to measure and determine what updates would be needed to install a walk-in, accessible shower.”*

Mission-driven, in-home visits by leadership

*“One of our clients was living in an environment that posed significant risks to her safety, including tripping and fall hazards due to an accumulation of household items. There was also no opportunity for socialization which caused them to feel isolated.*

*Fortunately, they were able to secure a new apartment that would provide them a fresh start!*

*Thanks to the coordination between their Field Manager and Direct Care staff, they were able to clean out the space and remove many items that were no longer needed. When the client was concerned about the cost of hiring a moving company, the Field Manager took the issue to the agency, and, through their advocacy efforts, were able to recruit a group of ten volunteers to help the client move into their beautiful new apartment.”*

## UNLIMITED TRUST

Trust forms the cornerstone of Unlimited Care’s relationships with staff, clients and their families. Field visits play a crucial role in driving meaningful change, gathering direct feedback and insights for continuous improvements and ensuring the highest level of service and support.

Through regular in-home check ins, office personnel provide field staff and clients with resources to live more independently at-home. Visits include distribution of accessible devices, ongoing staff education, support with initiating home modifications, acquiring grocery cards through insurance, transportation logistics, SNAP benefits, LIHEAP, and more.

# UNLIMITED COMMUNITY

Community is at the heart of Unlimited Care's service model. Strengthening partnerships, engaging clients, requesting feedback, and appreciating staff through regular outings continuously proves to be instrumental when delivering comprehensive, holistic care.

A key component to the organization's wellbeing is the monthly activity program, Ability Works. A no-cost initiative that invites clients and the community at-large to gather while socializing and learning in casual, fun settings with support available, if needed.

Beyond Unlimited Care's clients, 11 outside agencies proudly participate in the program.

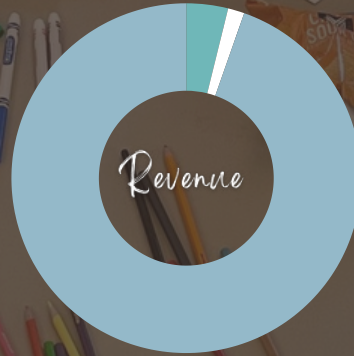
